Competition Fact Sheet	
Eligibility	Persons 19 years of age and older with a disability residing in the State of Arizona or one of Phoenix's ten sister cities: Calgary, Canada; Catania, Italy; Chengdu, China; Ennis, Ireland; Grenoble, France; Hermosillo, Mexico; Himeji, Japan; Prague, Czech Republic; Ramat-Gan, Israel; and Taipei, Taiwan.
Type of Art	Two dimensional watercolors, pastels, pen and ink, charcoal, photography, mixed media, and computer-generated art. All artwork <u>must</u> be mounted.
Size	No larger than 24"x30" (60cm x 75cm, including matting).
Theme	"A Voice of Our Own"
Entry Options	 A. Competition: Compete for prize money for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. No entry fee, but 1st piece donated to Disability Awareness Committee (DAC). If multiple entries, specify which is for donation; otherwise DAC will choose donated piece. Any additional pieces sold, split proceeds 50/50 between artist and DAC. B. Exhibition: No prize money, but awards for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place; \$15 entry fee per participant regardless of number of entries. Participants responsible for picking up their artwork or covering cost of packaging and mailing.
Judging	A panel of judges will evaluate entries on the basis of theme interpretation.
Due Date	October 9 th , 2015
Prizes	\$500 first place; \$300 second place, and \$150 third place, \$500 People's Choice. A certificate of participation will be given to all entrants.
Packing and Shipping	Art should be well-protected for shipment and shipped so that it reaches Phoenix by the contest due date. Please ship art to AICCD, 4545 North 36th Street, Suite 125A Phoenix, AZ 85018














This contest provides an opportunity for persons with disabilities to display their creativity through poetry.

WHAT TO SUBMIT:

ELIGIBILITY

Each participating writer, with a disability, must be at least 19 years of age by the competition's due date. Entries should be inspired by the theme and must be original unpublished work. Each writer may submit multiple entries.

Each entry must be submitted with a completed official entry form. All writers with disabilities 19 years and older from Arizona are eligible to participate, along with Phoenix Sister City international counterparts.

HOW TO SUBMIT:

FORMAT SPECIFICATION

- Poems shall be no more than 32 lines.
- Poems must be written in English.
- Poems must be submitted with a cover page listing the author's name, address, and phone number.
- The author's name must not be on the poem itself.
- Style is open.
- Subject matter is open, but must be consistent with the theme.
- It is requested that entries be submitted electronically in PDF or word file format, but please contact us for any special accommodation needed at:
- Entries not conforming to contest rules will be disqualified; entry fees will not be returned.

AWARDS & RECOGNITION

The grand prize winner will receive a \$500 cash award. Cash awards will also be giving to 2nd place (\$300) and 3rd place (\$150) winners.

A press release will be distributed to recognize all finalists. All entrants will receive a "Certificate of Participation" and recognition will be given to those entries that placed first, second, and third. Entries will also be published on the PSC/DAC website.


